Swearing-in of the 14th President of the Indian Republic was the highlight of the past fortnight. 'Dalit' rhetoric apart, this is for the first time that a politician from outside the Congress Party, that is, the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), graces that exalted post. Considering the respect across the party lines the Honourable Shri Kovind commands, perhaps it is also indicative of the polity belying the farce of 'secularist-nationalist' divide as propagated by discredited vested interests.

What however is remarkable is that a nation of illiterate destitutes at the time of independence came together to uphold the principles of democratic governance when most other newly independent nations fell into dictatorship and when even the advanced nations had not adopted the concept of universal franchise.
